We also have initiated a series of Ad Hoc teams.....those are new initiatives, or initiatives that deserve a deep dive and some revision. Those initiatives have been created by asking ourselves the questions, what does it mean to be a church that Embraces, Humanity?, that has an Open Canopy, that is Downtown Oriented, and that is know for its Generosity?

You will remember that during the Sacred Conversations last year those were the 4 values that we identified to guide our work. Randy Wells talked about Open Canopy last month...a description of how we embrace diverse humanity and provide safe harbor and spiritual shelter. Jimmy Carter described this as "different people, different backgrounds, different yearnings, different hopes, different dreams....not a melting pot but a beautiful mosaic".

As part of our Ad Hoc team initiatives Paula Harwood is leading us in to host a regular series of events entitled Community Gatherings. A time where we will serve meals, feature topics of interest, have an ice creamwith our focus on building our fellowship and our relationships.

Tony is leading a team that will host a regular series of events that welcomes members of the community at large to dialogue and discuss critical issues in our faith community. The focus of this initiative is to lead in our community as being a "thinking community of faith." We believe that this will introduce our church to others in the city who may have no idea who we are and who are looking for a place where they can ask questions and express doubt (remember Tony's message last week?) We have already dipped our toe in the water with this....when we educated ourselves about white nationalism, and learned from Ryan Burge about the group of our neighbors who claim "no religion".

John Martin is leading our work on the security of our church....and how we can maintain an open environment while still providing a secure environment.

It is our fervent hope that each of us will play a part in the work of our church....whether it be a standing team or one of our Ad Hoc adventures. That's part of one of the 4 values we have identified...the Value of Generosity. Jimmy Carter said "I have one life and one chance to make it count for something. My faith demands that I do whatever I can, wherever I am, whenever I can, for as long as I can with whatever I have to try to make a difference.

When we speak of Generosity we mean encouraging and equipping people to use their God given gifts like time, talents and resources for the glory of God.

In Matthew 5 Jesus tells us to not hide our light under a basket, but let it shine before others. Our light is our time, talent and recourses. God provides each of us with gifts and talents that, when used as God wants us to, will glorify Him and provide for those in need.
